Dear Mr. Jongeling:

Thank you for enquiring about Jerusalem. The counter mix is correct however the set up sheet is wrong. The paste up of the sheet got mixed up at the printers and the initial copies went out without an errata. I have enclosed a revised set up sheet for you and have high lighted the changes.

As to your other questions:

1. Units on top of the convoy do not have unlimited movement with the convoy.
2. See 1.
3. Units transported with the convoy may unload, fight and then reload if they have sufficient MF.
4. Other transport units can continue along with the convoy as long as they have sufficient MF.
5. Yes any unit may move next to an enemy unit in the non-road phase and wait until the road phase to attack.
6. El Kutub may not start ^{the} turn stacked with other Arab units.
7. El Kutub leadership value is 1.

Dear Mr. Jongeling:

You're right. The rules on the Jerusalem convoy do need some clarification, I apologize for that.


To serve as an escort the 6 infantry units must have transport; two 3-12 bus units for example, or 3 on the convoy and 3 on a bus unit. If stacked with the convoy the stack can only move as fast as the slowest unit, this does necessarily reduce the convoy's speed.

Loading and unloading off the convoy can be done an infinite number of times. Infantry and artillery units escorting the convoy (i.e. stacked with it) are restricted by their transports' MF.

The above rules give the Jewish player two options when deploying the convoy: Going light with only 3 Infantry/Artillery units and hopefully smashing through light Arab resistance quickly, or stacking with up to 6 infantry units, 2 buses and an artillery unit and slugging along the route.

Hopefully I have finally clarified all of your questions. When we reprint the rules we will expand on this section. I'm looking forward to your review.
