Infantry		9	1944 Infantry Battalion	L	The standard infantry battalion of the late period, whose anti-tank defence value reflects the increase of more anti-tank weapons such as the Panzerschreck and Panzerfaust.
		9	1944 Motorized Infantry Battalion	L	The standard motorized infantry battalion of the late period, whose anti-tank defence value reflects the increase of more anti-tank weapons such as the Panzerschreck and Panzerfaust.
		9	1944 Panzer-grenadier Battalion	L	The standard armored infantry battalion of the late period, whose anti-tank defence value reflects the increase of more anti-tank weapons such as the Panzerschreck and Panzerfaust.
Artillery (DF)		3	1942 Mobile Anti-Tank Battalion	E	The standard anti-tank battalion of the mobile divisions of the early period. Usually had two towed anti-tank companies and one self-propelled anti-tank company.
Assault Guns		4	Medium Tank Destroyer Battalion	M/L	Tank destroyer battalions equipped with self-propelled anti-tank gun armed vehicles carrying 75mm guns and having medium armor.
		4	Heavy Tank Destroyer Battalion	M/L	Tank destroyer battalions equipped with self-propelled anti-tank gun armed vehicles carrying long 75mm and 88mm guns and having heavy armor.
Tanks		3	Panzer III Battalion	E	The standard panzer battalion equipped with Panzer III light tanks with long 50mm guns.
		3	Panzer IVe Battalion	E	The standard panzer battalion equipped with Panzer IV medium tanks with a mixture of the short and medium length 75mm guns.
		3	Panzer VIe Battalion	M/L	The heavy panzer battalion equipped with Panzer VIe 'Tiger' heavy tanks.

		3	Panzer VIb Battalion	L	The heavy panzer battalion equipped with Panzer VIb 'King Tiger' heavy tanks.

Infantry		9	1942 Rifle Regiment	E	The standard rifle regiment in the rifle divisions in the early period.
		3	1942 Motorized Rifle Brigade	E	The standard motorized rifle brigade in the tank corps of the early period.
		5	Engineer Battalion (Rifle Division)	E/M/L	This is actually a reinforced engineer battalion as the regular battalion is so small that it is absorbed into the divisional headquarters. The reinforcements give it a river-bridging capability.
		3	1942 Mechanized Rifle Brigade	E	The standard mechanized rifle brigade in the mechanized corps of the early period.
		9	1942 Guards Rifle Regiment	E	The standard Guards rifle regiment of the Guards rifle divisions of the early period.
Artillery (DF)		3	1942 Mixed Artillery Brigade	E	This is the early variant of the Mixed Artillery Brigade which was in the mobile and cavalry corps in 1942.
		3	45mm Mobile Anti-Tank Battalion	E/M/L	The standard 45mm anti-tank battalion assigned to the mobile formations such as the tank and mechanized corps.
		3	57mm Mobile Anti-Tank Battalion	M/L	The standard 57mm anti-tank battalion of the Guards mobile formations.
		3	57mm Anti-Tank Battalion	M/L	This is the standard 57mm anti-tank battalion assigned to the rifle divisions. Note that these guns were not commonly assigned to the rifle division but instead were part of a larger anti-tank formation.

		3	76mm Anti-Tank Regiment	E/M/L	This is the standard anti-tank regiment of either 57mm or 76mm anti-tank guns, or both, that were assigned to the tank and mechanized corps. Doubled as a field gun regiment.
		3	85mm Anti-Tank Battalion	M/L	This is a special anti-tank battalion equipped with 85mm guns, with the specific mission of dealing with German heavy tanks. Assigned to the tank and mechanized corps.
		1	Anti-Aircraft Regiment	E/M/L	The standard anti-aircraft regiment assigned to the mobile formations. Uses the same rules as the German Anti-Aircraft Battalion.
<b>Artillery (RF)</b>		3	120mm Heavy Mortar Regiment	E/M/L	This was the standard 120mm heavy mortar regiment found in the mobile and cavalry formations.
		3	132mm Rocket Launcher Battalion	E/M/L	The standard 132mm rocket launcher battalion, usually found in the mobile formations.
		3	132mm Rocket Launcher Regiment	E/M/L	The standard 132mm rocket launcher regiment, usually found in a rocket launcher brigade, but also operated as an independent unit.
<b>Recon</b>		3	Motorcycle Battalion	E/M/L	The standard motorcycle reconnaissance battalion assigned to the tank and mechanized corps.
<b>Armored Cars</b>		3	Armored Car Battalion	E/M/L	The standard armored car reconnaissance battalion assigned to the tank and mechanized corps.
<b>Assault Guns</b>		3	76mm Assault Gun Regiment	M/L	This is the standard SU-76 regiment found in the mobile formation, and later in rifle divisions as well.
		3	100mm Assault Gun Regiment	L	This is the standard SU-100 regiment, usually an independent regiment, but sometimes attached to the mobile formations. Although mounted on a T-34 chassis, the SU-100 had transmission problems which kept the speed low and was not fixed until after the war.

		3	122mm (SU) Assault Gun Regiment	M/L	This is the standard SU-122 regiment, usually an independent regiment, but sometimes attached to the mobile formations.
		3	122mm (JSU) Assault Gun Regiment	L	This is the standard JSU-122 regiment, usually an independent regiment, but sometimes attached to the mobile formations.
<b>Tanks</b>		3	1942 Tank Brigade	E	This was the standard tank brigade of the early period, found in the mobile formations and also as an independent unit. They originally had a mixture of light, medium, and heavy tanks, although the heavy tanks were eventually removed and put in their own regiments.
		3	Medium Tank Regiment	E/M/L	The standard medium tank regiment of the Russian army. Had more tanks than a heavy tank regiment, but less tanks than a tank brigade and far less support units.
		3	KV Heavy Tank Regiment	E/M/L	This is the standard heavy tank regiment that was equipped with heavy tanks of the KV variety (KV-1c, KV-1s, and KV-85). It was an independent unit that was attached to any formation.
		3	JS Heavy Tank Regiment	L	This is the heavy tank regiment equipped with the JS-2 heavy tank. Like the KV version, it was an independent unit that was attached to any formation.
<b>HQs</b>		3	Mobile Division Headquarters	E/M/L	The standard division headquarters for the cavalry and artillery divisions.
